CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- All exhibitors must belong to a member club or society of Queensland Council of Garden Clubs Inc.
- 2. All exhibitors should comply with the standards set in The Australian Horticultural Show and Judges Manual.
- 3. There is no fee to enter any exhibit.
- 4. All entries in Sections 2, 3, 4 (Classes 10 to 59) must be owned (for at least 3 months) and grown by the Exhibitor and of Bench Standard in their species, otherwise, they may be rejected by the steward.
- 5. Hours of acceptance of entries will be strictly adhered to. All exhibits must be staged by 8.30am Friday when the hall will be closed for judging.
- 6. Entry form must accompany entries or may be emailed to secretary2@qcgc.net by 5pm Wednesday 26 March 2025.
- 7. Exhibits to be named, if known, on cards provided.
- 8. Stewards only will be allowed to move entries.
- 9. The judges' decision will be final.
- 10. Due care will be taken with exhibits; however, QCGC will not accept responsibility for any loss or damage.
- 11. No exhibit shall be removed before 3pm Saturday.

Conditions of Entry Section 1 - Floral Art

- 12. Flowers for Section 1 (Floral Art) may be bought.
- 13. Exhibitors enter the category according to the levels in their own club.
- 14. Exhibitors in Section 1 (Floral Art) that have won Novice or Intermediate categories twice in previous QCGC's Plant & Floral Spectacular or A Garden A-Fair are required to advance to the next category – unless otherwise approved by GCGC.
- 15. All exhibits must be the individual exhibitor's own work.
- 16. Plant material must predominate in all exhibits.
- 17. Any plant material in its natural state may be used. Artificially coloured plant material is permissible.
- 18. NO ARTIFICIAL PLANT MATERIAL IS ALLOWED
- 19. Drapes, bases and accessories may be used.
- 20. Fresh plant material must be in water or water retaining material unless it remains fresh without water for the full period of the show.
- 21. Any style of exhibit is permitted unless otherwise stated.

Conditions of Entry Section 2 Cut - Flowers and Foliage

- 22. Entries in Section 2 (Cut Flowers and Foliage) should be staged in plain bottles (green preferred) some bottles will be available for exhibitors.
- 23. No more than two cuts of a particular "variety" per exhibitor in any class of Section 2 (Cut Flowers and Foliage) (eg a person may enter 6 roses but only 2 of a Queen Elizabeth).

Conditions of Entry Section 5 - Photography

- 24. Photographs to be in colour.
- 25. Photographs must be taken by exhibitor and not won any previous QCGC Photography competition.
- 26. Each exhibitor may enter up to 3 photographs per class.
- 27. Size printed 15cm x 20cm (6"x8") and not mounted.
- 28. No personal identifiers or watermark can appear in the photographs.
- 29. Entry form and photographs must be posted to PO Box 5545, Stafford Heights Qld 4053 and received by 5pm Friday 7 March 2025.
- By entering photographs you agree that it can be used on QCGC website, social media or other promotional material with acknowledgement.
- 31. Copyright of the photographs belongs to the exhibitor.

Conditions of Entry Section 6 - Society Display

- 32. Size: floor space 2m x 2m. Maximum height 2m
- 33. Open to all specialist plant societies or special interest groups, other than garden clubs.
- 34. Horticultural material should predominate.
- 35. Entry form must be received by 5pm Friday 14 March 2025 either to PO Box 5545, Stafford Heights Qld 4053 or email secretary2@qcgc.net
- 36. Table and 2 chairs provided if required.

PRIZES and TROPHIES

Clubs and Societies

- The Harold Caulfield Perpetual Trophy will be presented to the Club or Society gaining the highest number of points in Section 2 Cut Flowers and Foliage.
- 4. The Carina Garden Club Dr. Jarvis Nye Perpetual Trophy will be presented to the Club or Society gaining the highest number of points in Section 4 Home Grown Produce.
- 5. **\$30.00** will be presented to the Clubs or Societies gaining the highest number of points in Sections 1 Floral Art, 2 Cut Flowers and Foliage, 3 Container Plants, 4 Home Grown Produce, 5 Photography.
- \$125 will be awarded to the winner of Section 6 Society Display. Second place will receive \$100.00.

- 7. The **President's Trophy** will be presented to the exhibitor gaining the highest individual points.
- 8. The **Noela Abeya Perpetual Trophy** will be presented for the best rose.
- 9. The **Turner Perpetual Trophy** will be presented for the best fern or fern ally.
- A prize will be given to the exhibitor gaining the most points in Section 1
 Floral Art Category A Advanced.
- 11. A prize will be given to the exhibitor gaining the most points in Section 1 Floral Art Category B Intermediate.
- 12. A prize will be given to the exhibitor whose exhibit shows the most promise in Section 1 Floral Art Category C Novice.
- 13. A prize may be given for the winning exhibit in selected classes (1 61).
